**Professor Tony Curtis** lived in Barry for more than 40 years and has had a 40-year career in Education as well as writing and editing over 40 books, most recently his first novel, (the topic this evening), and an anthology of poems for the Ty Hafan children's charity – *Where the Birds Sing our Names*.

He has been honoured with many prestigious literary awards including the Gregory Award and the Dylan Thomas Award for Spoken Poetry, judged by Dannie Abse and Dylan's daughter Aeronwy. He received a Cholmondeley Award in 1998 and was awarded a D.Litt. in 2004. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature.

#### January 4th Historic tales of Barry: a rapidly developing dock town

Meet Vale of Glamorgan and Barry Town Councillor Nic Hodges, who takes the stage to



regale us with fascinating stories about our town. With an exceptional flair for storytelling, Nic's animated talks are known to leave the audience spellbound. Drawing upon extensive archival and documentary research, Nic seamlessly weaves together photographic images and intriguing facts, bringing the rich history of Barry to life. Prepare to be amazed, entertained, and perhaps even shocked by the revelations. Nic is a

consummate storyteller, making this talk an unforgettable experience.

#### January 11<sup>th</sup>

John Furlong is a British educationist, author, and academic. He is an <a href="Emeritus">Emeritus</a> Professor of <a href="Education">Education</a> at the <a href="University of Oxford">University of Oxford</a>, an <a href="Emeritus Fellow of Green Templeton College">Emeritus Fellow of Green Templeton College</a>, <a href="Oxford">Oxford</a>, and an adviser to the <a href="Welsh Government">Welsh Government</a> on <a href="Initial Teacher Education">Initial</a> <a href="Teacher Education">Teacher Education</a> (ITE).

Set in 1969, 'Islands' is John's first non-academic publication; a memoir of the time he and his friend Mike lived and worked in Manhattan. That summer, New York became the epicentre of the brave new world of 'Alternative America' – drugs, meditation, the anti-war movement, gay liberation, civil rights, feminism. However, John became disillusioned, wanting to experience somewhere more 'real'.



'Islands' takes us to the Caribbean where he and Mike discover the pre-tourism beauty and simplicity of island life. But they also have to confront the reality of a collapsing British Empire which lays bare the legacy of 400 years of colonialism and slavery – the poverty and corruption that was always there but that the Brits refused to see. Then, on the tiny island of Carriacou, they meet Father Pat, a charismatic Marxist priest who asks John to join him in his struggle to create a more just society. But who was Father Pat and what did John learn from him? Only now, 50 years on, does John finally discover the priest's identity and his role in Grenada's socialist revolution of 1979 – that country's ill-fated bid to build its own brave new world.

### January 18<sup>th</sup> 'PHARMACOGENOMICS'

Have you ever had a reaction to a medication? Perhaps you developed a

You know that just because your neighbour tolerated a medication doesn't mean that you will too, but there's no way to know if you will react to a drug until you try it.
